Executive Summary

On April 25, 2015, a 7.8 Richter earthquake hit Nepal. Nearly 9,000 people died, over 22,000 people were injured and more than 8,000 schools were destroyed, as communities got shattered. The desperate circumstances were testing the moral compasses of every living citizen of Nepal. The Society of Ex-Budhanilkantha Students (SEBS) was one of the first few civil society organizations to respond to the overwhelming need for relief operations, dispatching its first relief consignment on April 30.

Established in 1982, the Society of Ex-Budhanilkantha Students (SEBS) is the alumni organization of one of the leading public schools of Nepal - Budhanilkantha School. It is a not-for-profit organization registered at the District Administration Office, Kathmandu, and the Social Welfare Council, under the Social Welfare Act 1992. SEBS was established to serve its members, its alma mater (Budhanilkantha School), and the society.

With the support of its global network of over 4,000 members, SEBS was able to reach out to the earthquake survivors of 16 earthquake-affected districts of Nepal - *Sindhupalchowk, Nuwakot, Rasuwa, Dolakha, Kavre, Ramechhap Kathmandu, Bhaktapur, Lalitpur, Dhading, Gorkha, Lamjung, Chitwan, Makwanpur, Okhaldhunga, and Solukhumbu*. SEBS earthquake response was executed in two phases: 1) Immediate Relief (Earthquake Relief Action Project - ERAP), and 2) Post-Earthquake Reconstruction Project.

Institutionally, SEBS distributed over 10,500 tarpaulins, more than 3,000 sacks of rice (90 tonnes), and other immediate relief materials. It also funded multiple projects led by our members, other civil society leaders (volunteers), and partner organizations. As the relief project ended in August 2015, SEBS decided to utilize the remaining funds to reconstruct a school. The *Reconstruction Committee*, led by Komal Karki (100 A) completed the reconstruction of *Shree Devi Primary School, Bhaktapur* in June 2019.

As a volunteer-run, volunteer-based organization, it would not have been possible for SEBS to organize such a massive relief and reconstruction project without the support of its volunteers. The organization recognizes the efforts of 100+ volunteers who prioritized their contribution to society in a time where their families were also struggling to cope with the effects of the earthquake. It also recognizes the contribution of our donors. SEBS is grateful to its partner organizations for supporting fundraising, and procurement and distribution of relief materials. Two organizations, in particular, need a special mention: *Buddha Air* and *SEBS North America*. Without their support, SEBS could never reach out to more than 100,000 people.

SEBS is committed to uphold its accountability standards and accept responsibilities to maintain transparency with donors, members, and constituencies. This report is an attempt to operationalize this commitment. Prior to publishing this report: 1) SEBS had completed the due processes of auditing its financial statements annually, 2) submitted the required documents to the District Administration Office, Kathmandu, and renewed the legal status from 2015-2018, 3) shared progress reports and presented it to the members in annual general meetings, and 4) **most importantly** published all financial details of earthquake relief project in *The Himalayan Times*, publicly, on 11/8/2015.

The Report

The report has been divided into **four sections**. The first section contains details about the *Earthquake Relief Action Project*, providing a summary of the relief related works completed institutionally and in collaboration with members and partners. The second section contains details about the *Post-Earthquake Reconstruction Project*. The third and the fourth sections - annexes - contain pieces of evidence for *Section 1* and *Section 2*, respectively.

Multiple sources were considered while preparing this report. The evidence and project details were generated from individual project reports, various versions of reports, and memos within SEBS, the social media platform of SEBS (www.facebook.com/sebsonline), SEBS-eSewa relief record portal (www.sebs.esewa.com.np), SEBS-North America's relief reports and consultation with volunteers coordinating the projects. SEBS is grateful to the individuals and organizations for their support during the process.

The report was prepared for: 1) Members, partners and collaborators, willing to learn about the projects, and the scope of the contribution, and 2) the District Administration Office, Kathmandu, to facilitate an ongoing followup on post-earthquake relief and reconstruction projects led by Civil Society Organizations of Nepal.

Dates mentioned in this document are project approved dates, funds transferred dates or project completed dates (mostly). The financial details of the projects can be retrieved from the audited financial statements of 2072, 2073 and 2074, available at [SEBS Online](#). The DAO also has a copy of the financial statements.

Finally: *Nepal was in a humanitarian crisis after the devastating earthquake. Our communities were in dire need of immediate relief. Amidst such circumstances, the executive committee of SEBS had to choose efficiency over effectiveness for some of its decisions. There were times when we accepted quicker delivery of relief materials over a well-minuted distribution process or decided for a helicopter dispatch without discussing cost efficiency. Therefore, we request our readers to read this report with the fair judgment of time, need, and circumstances.*

1. SEBS Earthquake Relief Action Project (ERAP)

1.1 Overview

Between April and August 2015, the Field Coordination Team of SEBS Earthquake Relief Action Project (ERAP) distributed more than 10,500 tarpaulins and 90 tonnes (3,000 30-kg sacks) of rice, along with several other relief materials like tents, blankets, other food materials, medicines, sanitary pads, and other essential relief materials to the earthquake-affected communities of Nepal. Using its network of fellow SEBSers and other partner organizations, SEBS was able to reach the communities in eleven earthquake-affected districts of Nepal. ERAP's relief effort is summarized in this section.

1.2 Institutional Activities, Events, and Timeline¹

1. 30/04/2015: Buddha Air published a press release announcing its collaboration with SEBS for the Earthquake Relief Action Project. The company contributed NRs 50,00,000/- (fifty lakhs) as an initial commitment to the cause. Buddha Air was a major donor in the relief project. SEBS is grateful to Birendra Bahadur Basnet (200 A, Executive Director, Buddha Air) for his contribution to the relief and reconstruction project. SEBS set up a volunteer camp in Buddha Air's Office. Over three months more than 100 volunteers served in the relief project. Active communication, records, and procurement teams were set up. Key members leading the team were Rabindra Maharjan (200B) and Bijaya Babu Shiwakoti (300C) (Field Coordination Team), Samrat Dahal (500B) (Procurement), Babin Raj Satyal (100B) (Volunteer Management), Jagadish Bhattarai (200B) (Records and Accounts), Sneedha Mainali (100C) (Overall Coordination), Suman Mandal (200C) and Kaushal Sapkota (000/0C) (Communications).
2. 30/04/15: SEBS Preliminary Survey Team (consisting of 6 people, led by Bijaya Babu Shiwakoti and Rabindra Maharjan) left for *Sindhupalchowk* for observation, data collection, and local liaison arrangements. They distributed 20 sacks of beaten rice as immediate relief to the people of *Ramche* and *Maheshwora*. Mike and Patti Locke, from *Human Touch*, Sarit Rana (200a) and Tashi Shakya from Bungamati donated the relief material. Buddha Air provided logistical support for the dispatch. This marked the beginning of SEBS ERAP.
3. 1/5/15: Dr. Tejsu Singh Malla (248 C, Immediate Past President and SEBS and SEBS-NA Representative in China) coordinated with Nepali students from *Southeast University in Nanjing, China* to send medical supplies for our health camps. Dr. Sulav Pradhan coordinated the delivery.
4. 2/5/15: SEBS collaborated with Nepal Relief to distribute 70 tarpaulins to *Sudal VDC (Bhaktapur)*, *Madanpur (Nuwakot)*, *Baruwa, Kalika, Thokarpa (Sindhupalchowk)*, *Barpak (Gorkha)* and *Lalitpur*. Deependra Chaulagain (Nepal Relief) coordinated the distribution.

¹ The report does not include small-scale donations. For example: On 3/5/15, SEBS delivered 55 packets of Diapers to Bal Mandir, Kathmandu. Subodh Manandhar (571 B) made the contribution.

5. 2/5/15: SEBS distributed 1001 30-kg sacks of rice and 1,001 tarpaulins to seven VDCs of Sindhupalchowk - *Gaati, Listi, Marming, Ghorthali, Karthali, Thumthang, and Maneshwora*. The distribution was led in collaboration with *Udhyog Banijya Sangh, Sindhupalchowk*, and a local liaison coalition set up by SEBS Preliminary Survey Team at Barhabise, Sindhupalchowk. The local coalition consisted of members from all major political parties and local representatives. The distribution was led by Dr. Sneedha Mainali (President of SEBS).
6. 4/5/15: SEBS published an appeal in major national dailies of Nepal to request fellow Nepali citizens to join the relief campaign. Through this appeal, SEBS shared about its working procedure and its relief strategy to provide “1 tarp and 1 30-kg sack of rice” to one family for every Rs. 2,320.00. *Buddha Air* sponsored the publication.
7. 4/5/15: SEBS delivered 4 (21 ft. X 12 ft.) tarpaulins to *Pabitra Samaj Sewa Nepal*, an orphanage of 35 children and few elderly people. The distribution was coordinated by Bishal Raj Khanal (8000 C).
8. 6/5/15: SEBS ERAP dispatched 2000 sacks of rice (30-kg sack) and 2000 tarps (15ft. X 18ft., 90 GSM) for the residents of 24 VDCs of *Melamchi, Sindhupalchowk*. A team of eleven volunteers including Rabindra Maharjan and Bijay Babu Shiwakoti (Field Coordinators) and Keshar Khulal (Principal, Budhanilkantha School) successfully handed over the relief materials. The distribution was coordinated with the support of Major Prem Hamal of *Bhimkali Gulma* (Nepal Army), local leaders, including officials and party representatives (an all-party coalition). The collective distribution was another example of the collaborative and collective nature of SEBS ERAP (as [The Kathmandu Post Reports](#)).
9. 9/5/15: SEBS ERAP delivered 2,000 tarpaulins and 300 blankets to *Barda Bahadur Gadh*, of Nepal Army in Dolakha. 500 tarpaulins and 300 blankets were for *Sundrawati* and *Kshmwawati*. Remaining 1,500 tarps were handed over to the District Relief Distribution Centre of Dolakha. The distribution was facilitated by Ajay Babu Shiwakoti, and distributed in the presence of Pashupati Chaulagain (MP-Dolakha), Rudra Bdr. Khadka (Former Chairperson, District Development Committee, Dolakha). Dr. Sneedha Mainali (100 C), Samrat Dahal (500 B) and Bijay Babu Shiwakoti (300 C) led the delivery.
10. 10/5/15: SEBS ERAP delivered 3,000 tarpaulins to *Bipad Byabasthapan Samitee* (Disaster Management Committee), *Sindhupalchowk* delivered to Armed Police Forces in *Barhabise, Sindhupalchowk*. The distribution was coordinated in the presence of Bishnu Khatri (Member of Nepali Congress Central Committee), Saral Sahayatri Paudel (District Leader, CPN-Maoist), and Prem Lama (Regional President, CPN). Bijay Babu Shiwakoti (300 C) led the dispatch.
11. 11/5/15: Dr. Sneedha Mainali and Dr. Bishal Paudel organized a health camp that would benefit 297 locals of *Kanpur, Kavrepalanchowk*. The team also distributed tarpaulins, blankets, mattresses, sanitary pads, and baby diapers, in the presence of local leaders.

The event was led by the President (Dr. Sneedha Mainali) and the Treasurer (Kaushal Sapkota) of SEBS.

12. 15/5/15: SEBS ERAP dispatched 400 tarpaulins to Okhaldhunga (200 tarps) and Dhading (200 tarps). In Okhaldhunga, *Seti Devi Shrijnashil Youth Club* coordinated the distribution of relief materials to the residents of *Singhadevi VDC*. In Dhading, the distribution benefited the residents of *Chatre Deurali VDC (Dhading)*. Rabindra Maharjan facilitated the dispatch. Buddha Air provided logistical support to deliver it.
13. 17/5/15: SEBS ERAP dispatched 150 blankets, food supplies and 50 tarpaulins (12 ft. X 15 ft.) to the Disaster Management Committee formed in *Mahalaxmi Municipality-1, Bhangeri Fedikhola*, in the presence of Sita Neupane (*Shanti Education Initiative*), Indra Bahadur Tamang, Ganesh Tamang, Bhim Bahadur Tamang, Prabesh Lama and Prajwal Khadka (Members, Disaster Management Committee). Rabindra Maharjan facilitated the dispatch.
14. 20/5/15: Realizing the traumatizing effect of the earthquake on children, SEBS ERAP designed and implemented multiple storytelling and entertainment camps for children of *Kathmandu* and *Lalitpur*. The camps benefited children at KIST Hospital (Kathmandu), Ama Ghar (Kathmandu), and a makeshift shelter in Jawalakhel (Lalitpur). Students of Budhanilkantha School joined as volunteers. Materials used in the camp were donated for student's benefits. The camps were led by Dr. Sneedha Mainali and Surya Chataut (200 B). The camps were carried out in May and June. The first camp was organized on May 20.
15. 21/5/15: SEBS ERAP dispatched 480 tarpaulins (15 ft. X 18 ft.), and Rs. 400,000 worth of food items, utensils, and sanitary goods for the people of *Saprubeshi, Rasuwa*. The relief was led by Sudeep Acharya. Bishan Wagle, Laxman Sherpali, Amul Thapa, Dawa, Rabindra Maharjan, and Samrat Dahal joined the team.
16. 23/5/15: SEBS ERAP dispatched 45 mats for the people of *Kagati VDC* in *Nuwakot*. The relief was coordinated in collaboration with the *Richa Foundation* (Prabesh Maharjan). SEBS-NA and SEBS Bangalore sponsored the donation.
17. 23/5/15: SEBS ERAP handed over 300 tarpaulins to *Nepal Share*. Rabindra Maharjan coordinated the handover. The tarps were received by Samriddha Rana, the representative of Nepal Share.
18. 11/8/15: Upon the conclusion of major relief projects, SEBS published its financial details in *The Himalayan Times*. The publication was sponsored by *Buddha Air*. It ensured transparency and accountability in actions.
19. 11/2/2016 - SEBS procured and distributed blankets, wheelchairs (10), cane and aluminium crutches (10) to *Ujjwal Nakshyatra Samaj, Kathmandu*. The relief was coordinated in collaboration with *Bright Future Society*.
20. 22/01/16: SEBS distributed blankets to 2,060 families of *Thulo Sirubari, Sindhupalchowk*. The project was executed in collaboration with *Nyanopan, SEBS*

North America and Sagarmatha Nepali Woman's Group, Texas. Dr. Sneedha Mainali led the distribution along with Captain Vijay Lama (*Nepal Airlines and Nyanopan*). The team also distributed warm clothes procured during a month-long winter drive in Kathmandu.

21. 16/3/16 - SEBS distributed 165 quilts (12 ft. X 9 ft.) and 81 sleeping bags to *Surke, Phaplu, and Thetang (Solukhumbu)*. The project was coordinated by Dr. Sneedha Mainali (136 C, President) and supported by Captain Vijay Lama (*Nyanopan*), Bijay Bokhim (*Nepalese Association of Houston*), Bijay Gurung, Sanjay Bade Shrestha, Jitendra Shrestha and Suresh Neupane.
22. 20/8/16 - SEBS donated Rs. 10,00,000.00/- to Budhanilkantha School to support its post-earthquake reconstruction. The donation was made during the 34th AGM of SEBS held at the premises of Budhanilkantha School. *4 Peace of Mind, UK's* donation was used upon discussion with the donors. Budhanilkantha School used the funds to reconstruct the dining hall area.

1.3 SEBS ERAP Collaboration and Funded Projects

SEBS, alongwith SEBS-North America and other organizations, funded and organized relief operations by collaborating with its members (fellow alums of Budhanilkantha School), their organizations, and other partners. This section explains the details of such relief operations.

23. April-May 2015: On 28/4/15 and 4/5/15 Biswash Chepang (1025 D) led relief projects in the *Chepang* villages of *Jimling (Chitwan)* and *Handikhola VDC (Makwanpur)* respectively. The project provided immediate relief materials, like tarpaulin, rice, and food, to around 300 families collectively. On 18/5/15 Biswash collaborated with Surendra Shakya (161 A) to provide tents to the residents of *Madanpur-9, Pakhure, Dillipur* and *Basantapur Handikhola VDC, Makwanpur*. The projects were supported by SEBS North America and facilitated by SEBS.
24. 10/5/15: Dr. Badri Chapagain procured relief materials from *Nepalgunj, Banke* which were distributed to a community in *Tokha (Kathmandu)*. The relief was carried out in collaboration with Budhanilkantha School and SEBS in the presence of Keshar Khulal (800 A, Principal, Budhanilkantha School) and Krishna Chettri (500 B). The relief materials were also sent to *Sindhupalchowk, Nuwakot, Dhading* and *Gorkha*.
25. 28/5/15: Kanchan Basnyat (123 B) distributed food and necessary supplies (including 23 tarpaulins) to the residents of *Sunkhani VDC, Ward No. 2 (Sindhupalchowk)*. 82 out of 84 houses in the community were destroyed.
26. 23/5/15: Krishna Chettri (503 B) and Shanti Giri distributed relief materials, including bamboo posts to *Shanti Sewa Lepar Community* in *Tokha (Kathmandu)*. Shanti Giri also coordinated a relief distribution in *Khaping VDC, Ward 2, 3 and 4, Duragaon (Ramechhap)*.
27. May - June 2015: Reported on 14/6/15, *Clean Up Nepal* distributed relief materials to 50 households of *Machhegaun (Lalitpur)*. The project was coordinated by Neelam

Pradhananga, Global Coordinator of Clean Up Nepal. SEBS-North America funded the project.

28. May 2015: *Project Sahayeta* worked with local groups in *Ale Gaun, Mulpani (Dhading)* to provide temporary shelters for 120 homes, benefiting an estimated 740 people. The total cost includes the cost for 2 vehicles used to transport the load and the volunteers. Nisha Thapa, *Founder/Executive Director, Sahayeta*, led the project.
29. May 2015: Sanjiv Adhikari coordinated immediate relief supplies to the residents of *Badegaun-8 (Sindhupalchowk), Chilankha (Dolakha)* and *Chitlang (Kavre)*. SEBS-NA funded the project. SEBS facilitated it. Bishal Shrestha and Bimal Nepal (107 A) contributed for the project. The consignment for *Chilankha* was distributed by Rastra Bhusan Khadka (267 B) (see ERAP #31).
30. Dr. Sneedha Mainali (136 C) (see institutional projects #13)
31. 15/5/15: Rastra Bhusan Khadka (267 B) coordinated with various organizations to transport and distribute tarpaulins, rice and other relief materials to the villagers of *Chilankha (180+ blankets), Khopa (180+ blankets) and Bigu (90+ tarpaulins and blankets) (Dolakha)*. The project started when Rastra (SEBS) got an SOS email asking for immediate help. Within 30 hours of receiving the email, SEBS was able to arrange a helicopter to drop off the relief to the village. The relief was organized in collaboration with *The Women's Foundation, CKASS* and *SEBS North America*. Rastra also managed to deliver relief materials of other organizations like *Nyaano Sansaar* and *Mission Aviation Fellowship*. SEBS and SEBS-NA funded the airdrop.
32. 1/5/15: Sandip Sen Thakuri coordinated the relief campaign in *Jholunge, Majhigaun, Sindhupalchowk* with the funds disbursed by SEBS and funded by SEBS North America. The relief was coordinated in collaboration with *Educating Nepal*. Jholunge is a marginalized community of *Majhis*. Post 2015 Gorkha Earthquake, all 73 houses in the village were destroyed. The relief included tents, mattresses, food (35 sacks of rice, 105 kgs of pulses and beans, 50 kgs of salt, sugar, and tea, 10 packs of oil, 100 kgs of beaten rice, among others), medicines and first aid, water purifier and other essential relief materials.
33. 14/5/15: Umesh Pariyar, Bishnu Pariyar (365C) and Shashi Gyawali (341B) coordinated a relief project in *Dhamilikuwa (Lamjung)* for ward numbers 1-9, distributing 200 tarpaulins, 80 sacks of rice, 10 sacks of lentils, 10 packets oil, 375 pcs. of bamboos and 200 pieces of mats. The project was organized in collaboration with SEBS-NA and *Nepalese American Friends Association (NAFA)*, Arizona, USA.
34. May - June 2015: Reported to SEBS on 11/6/15, *Youth Thinkers Society* coordinated several relief projects to provide relief materials to 560 families of *Lalitpur* and *Makwanpur* collectively. The project was coordinated by Chewan Rai, President of Youth Thinkers Society, funded by SEBS North America and facilitated by SEBS.

35. 20/5/15: Dirgha Raj Ghimire and Sanjiv Shrestha (062 B) coordinated a relief operation in *Kolki, Lamjung*. The relief consignment included food and other necessary supplies.
36. 23/5/15: Dhiraj Man Shrestha (118 B) distributed relief materials in *Jyamirkot (Kavre)* and *Sarkigaun (near Lubhu, Lalitpur)*, and coordinated a health camp for over 400 patients in *Siddhipur (Lalitpur)*.
37. May 2015: Nikesh Prajapati (073 B) organized several earthquake relief camps in *Banepa* and *Kavre* in places like *Nala, Tukucha, Ghimire Gaun, Magar Gaun, Deupar, Gairbisauna, Panauti, Sankhu, Barhabisey, Mudku Bhanjyang, Nayagaun, and Kaule Shankarapur*, benefiting over 250 households. The project was supported by SEBS North America and *Nepalese American Organization of Ohio (NAOO), USA*.
38. May 2015: Prabhakar Ghimire coordinated immediate relief in *Barhabise* and *Kuntabesi (Sindhupalchowk)*. Rice and tarps were distributed to the residents of Barhabise, while 80 families in Kuntabesi received rice, lentils, other food materials, and tarpaulins.
39. April-May 2015: 1) Immediately after the earthquake, SEBS supported disaster response at various hospitals of Kathmandu, including *Teaching Hospital* and *Bir Hospital*. The funds provided by SEBS were used to distribute food and other relief materials to the earthquake victims and their families as they waited for their treatment in those hospitals, and to create temporary shelter and volunteer camp at the *Teaching Hospital*. Several organizations collaborated for the project. Volunteer Raghav Pokharel coordinated the relief. 2) SEBS also supported the team to procure food materials, tarpaulins, and medicine to provide immediate relief materials to the various earthquake affected places of Nepal including *Chepang Village in Makwanpur* and *Chitwan*.
40. 6/5/15: Sanjay Pradhan (152 B) distributed immediate relief materials (food and other necessities) to the people of *Gurje Bhanjyang (Nuwakot)* and *Pakhure Madanpur VDC-9 (Nuwakot)*. Madan Paneru joined him for the distribution in Pakhure.
41. May 2015: Samtenla Sherpa (372 B) coordinated two relief campaigns for SEBS. On 4/5/15, a team of volunteers distributed food and tents to 200 families of *Bhotechaur (Sindhupalchowk)*. On 5/23/15 Samtenla Sherpa (372 B) distributed food and other necessary relief materials to various communities of *Ghyampeshaal Bazaar, Masel VCD (Gorkha)*.
42. May 2015 - Ujjwal Shrestha (160 B) conducted and coordinated multiple projects for SEBS. On 4/5/15, he led his first relief campaign in *Jaubari, Phinam*, and other nearby villages (*Gorkha*). 25 volunteers, including 2 doctors and a team of medical workers, were able to deliver relief supplies to 120 families, thereby benefiting 800 residents of 11 villages in 4 wards. On 10/5/15, Ujjwal carried out a relief project targeting 100 families, benefiting 575 residents in *Katunje-7 (Dhading)*. The mission was initiated by *Chitwan Yuwa Samuha*. On 19/5/15, Ujjwal Shrestha led yet another relief project

to 150 families from 5 villages in 3 wards of *Katunje VDC (Dhading)*. All the projects led by Ujjwal were supported by SEBS-North America and facilitated by SEBS.

43. 7/5/15: Dr. Unnat Shrestha (461 B) delivered food and other necessary immediate relief materials to the people of *Tistung (Nuwakot)*. The project was completed in coordination with the *Chitwan Youth Club*.
44. 25/5/15: Roshan Thapaliya (277 D) distributed food supplies to the earthquake-affected families of *Aginchowk VDC (Dhading)*. Each family received a relief package consisting of 5 kg rice, 2 kg lentil, 1 packet salt, 1 packet cooking oil, and some sugar. 200 families of Ward No. 8 and 9 benefited from this relief. The project was a joint effort of SEBS, SEBS-NA, and *Earlham College of Richmond, Indiana, USA*.
45. 4/5/15: Milan Gautam and *Patitar Youth Team (Bouddha - 6)* delivered food, household supplies, and medicines to the people of *Badegaun (Sindhupalchowk)* and *Gairi Bisauni, Deupar* including *Dam Pokhari*, and *Simchaur (Kavre)*. The project was conducted in three phases.

2. Post-Earthquake Reconstruction Project

2.1 Overview

Following the end of the Earthquake Relief Action Project, the Executive Committee of SEBS formed an independent committee to plan, organize, and lead the reconstruction of a community school. The 5-member *Reconstruction Committee*, led by Komal Karki (132 A), was endorsed at the 33rd Annual General Meeting of SEBS organized on August 22, 2015. Between 2015 and 2019, the committee reconstructed the *Shree Devi Primary School*, Bhaktapur. The reconstructed school was handed over to the community on June 10, 2019.

2.2 Major Milestones and Summary

1. SEBS decided to utilize excess funds from ERAP to reconstruct a community school. Following the decision, SEBS formed a 5-member reconstruction committee to plan, organize, and lead the reconstruction project. The *Reconstruction Committee*, led by Komal Karki (100 A), included Sneedha Mainali (100 C)/Vidhan Rana (300 C) (SEBS President/s as Ex-Officio Members), Gyanendra Raj Pandey (900 A), Hemendra Bohra (900 A) and Sanjay Shrestha (200 B). The reconstruction committee was endorsed at the 33rd Annual General Meeting of SEBS organized at the premises of Budhanilkantha School on August 22, 2015.
2. Initially, *Kanpur Higher Secondary School*, Kavrepalanchowk was selected for the reconstruction project. However, the school was able to secure better funding opportunities through the *Indian Embassy School Reconstruction Program*. In order to avoid duplication of resources, the reconstruction committee looked for other alternative schools. Following a careful due diligence process, the committee selected ***Shree Devi Primary School*** in *Chittapol, Bhaktapur (Suryabinayak Municipality-13)* was selected for the reconstruction project. The reconstruction committee and the school management committee of Shree Devi Primary School signed a memorandum of understanding for the construction of a new 4-classroom building.
3. The reconstruction committee decided to follow the government-approved design - with potential for enhancements like reflecting Bhaktapur's local culture and architecture - to reconstruct the building. Accordingly, a tripartite agreement between the Ministry of Education's Central Level Project Implementation Committee, Government of Nepal's National Reconstruction Authority, and SEBS Reconstruction Committee was signed on May 28, 2017.
4. On November 6, 2017, the contract to construct the building was awarded to ***Kritisha Construction Pvt. Ltd.*** for an amount of NPR. 8,297,262.81 (including VAT). The selection was done after an open bidding call for the construction project. It was published in a national daily.
5. Following the completion of the building, the school management committee requested SEBS to construct a *Chautara* and the boundary fences. The reconstruction committee also decided to revamp the CGI sheet roof by constructing a UPVC roof for better

performance. The final cost of the construction of the building and other additional works including Chautara was NPR. 9,992,913.53 (including VAT).

6. The building was completed for the 2076 academic session. It was officially inaugurated by the Deputy Mayor of Suryabinayak Municipality, Mrs. Juna Basnet, on June 10, 2019. The reconstruction committee handed over the new building to the school management committee on the same day.
7. The reconstruction project hired 2 staff: Biswash Chepang (1000 D)/Bharat Nepali (2000 D) as Project Coordinator (in different phases), and Anish Pathak (000/o C) (Engineer/Coordinator). SEBS would like to thank them for their contribution during the project.

Using its nation wide volunteers and members SEBS initiated the Relief Work immediately after the Gorkha earthquake of April 25th, 2015 and was able to start distribution of relief material within a week - May 2nd, 2015. We started with the immediate relief with one 15' x 18' tarpaulin and one 30kg sack of rice per household. The first distribution was 3,000 tarpaulins and 3,000 sacks of rice in Barabise and Melemchi. We worked closely with local representatives of all political parties, local administration, Police and Nepal Army representatives and made sure that the relief distribution was transparent and equitable. We distributed the relief material with minimum administrative costs using our network of members and partners. The relief work was later expanded to several other earthquake affected areas.

Ex-students and volunteers all over the world actively contributed particularly SEBSNA and members from UK, Australia, Europe, India and several other countries. Many SEBS members contributed through their batches. Even with our best efforts, we have not been able to list all the contributions received because of problems with bank information which is sometimes not able to provide the accurate source of contributions received in our account. Attached list is not exhaustive. We are working closely with the bank to sort out all the contributors in more transparent way and will bring out the full information as soon as possible. We thank everyone who participated in this relief work and now we have started our next phase as reconstruction in the devastated area with the remaining, which is about NPR 13million. We plan to construct at least 20 schools in the earthquake affected areas and have formed a steering committee to lead the initiatives. The details of the plan will be shared with all SEBS members and well wishers in the days to come. As always SEBS will ensure highest level of transparency and accountability in utilization of funds from the members and donors.
