Encouragingly, during our engagements with the Ministries, we learned that new provisions will formally recognize alumni organizations like ours. As Nepal's federal structure takes shape, SEBS will need to align its own Bidhan accordingly though this will take time. We understand some of our members are growing impatient, but we must remain patient and strategic, keeping in step with the evolving legal landscape.

Throughout the year, we've continued to build bridges across generations through Networking Events and dialogues. Our Alumni Talk Series has not only showcased the diverse talents of our members but also deepened the connection between current BNKS students and the SEBS family - our future alumni.

There is also increasing interest in establishing SEBS branches in various provinces. While we are optimistic about this idea, we believe thoughtful deliberation and broader consensus will be essential before moving ahead.

Before closing, I thank each and every one of you whether you contributed time, resources, or simply your presence to help keep the SEBS spirit alive. We move forward with a shared purpose, embracing both our legacy and the new energy our younger members bring. Looking forward, SEBS will continue its trademark activities like SEBS Sandhya, Meet & Greet and Networking with a richer SEBS community.

Together, we are SEBSers stronger, bolder, and more united than ever.
