Meeting Brief: The 43rd Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Society of Ex-Budhanilkantha Students (SEBS) was convened on 30th August, 2025, at the Assembly Hall, Budhanilkantha School. The meeting was chaired by the President of SEBS, Santosh Bisht. Adhering to the SEBS Bidhan 2052, the official notice of the AGM was publicly released on 8th August, 2025, through the national daily newspaper 'Kantipur', providing adequate time for members and interested stakeholders to prepare for participation.

Welcome Speech:

General Secretary Aditi Singh welcomed the members that participated. She appreciated the overwhelming amount of registrations and candidacies, thanked the Executive Committee for the help and support throughout her tenure. She also recited the letter sent by SEBS NA for the AGM.

Address By:

Mr. Neel Krishna Tamrakar, SEBS Representative to Board of Trustees of Budhanilkantha School

Mr. Tamrakar was not physically present; Rahul Singh recited the letter he addressed to the AGM. Firstly, he thanked the Executive Committee for choosing him in the position. He highlighted the role of alumni in the school and mentioned that he will work for the betterment of the school and SEBS. He highlighted that the Board of Trustees provides crucial strategic governance and oversight, ensuring the school's long-term vision and financial health are secured. Alongside this, he emphasized the dedicated alumni serve as invaluable ambassadors, whose advocacy and philanthropic support are essential for BNKS to achieve its goal of becoming a recognized center of excellence. As a member of the Board of Trustees, he committed to work with diligence and a steadfast commitment to collaborative progress. He mentioned he is wholeheartedly dedicated to supporting the school in every capacity to protect its esteemed image and advance its mission.

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Mr. Arun Kumar Neopane, SEBS Representative to Friends of Budhanilkantha School (FOBS)

Mr. Arun Kumar Neopane, emphasized the importance of a holistic approach to student well-being, specifically highlighting nutrition, health, inclusive, and hygiene. He stated that FOBS is committed to providing financial support for initiatives that directly benefit students. He mentioned with deep sense of responsibility and pride that he presents the highlights of FOBS recent deliberations. He mentioned FOBS, in close partnership with SEBS and the school leadership, has been working tirelessly to ensure that Budhanilkantha School remains not only a beacon of academic excellence but also a nurturing environment for our students. His key highlights were the following:

- *Governance and Representation:* Formally welcomed as the SEBS representative to the FOBS Executive Committee. This strengthens the vital connection between our alumni and the current school community.
- *Sub-Committees and Inclusion* FOBS has structured sub-committees in key areas — academics, catering and nutrition, health and hygiene, student welfare and safety, and infrastructure and development. Each committee now includes coordinators and parents, ensuring inclusive and shared ownership of decisions.
- *Finance and Transparency:* The FOBS Fund has been fully institutionalized. Contributions from parents are carefully managed under separate accounting, dedicated strictly to student welfare and FOBS operations. All expenses require committee approval, with monthly financial reporting for transparency. Bank operations are safeguarded with multi-signature authority, and fees for the upcoming session have been set responsibly, with flexibility to adjust if national teacher salary standards change.
- *Student Welfare and Education:* FOBS is committed to providing extra academic support to students who need it, supporting participation in national and international competitions, and introducing adolescent health and awareness programs in collaboration with various stakeholders. FOBS has also strengthened our policy of respectful security staff behavior and parent-teacher-management interactions.
- *Infrastructure and Development:* Our inspection teams have recommended practical improvements: safety grills and gates in hostels, parquetting of dormitories, toilet upgrades in older blocks, and addressing noise disturbances from nearby establishments. These actions ensure that our school remains safe, healthy, and conducive to learning.
- *Community and the Way Forward:* FOBS continues to honor outstanding contributions from staff and students and will engage directly with prefects, house captains, and past leaders to chart a long-term strategy.

In conclusion, he highlighted every step FOBS takes — whether financial, structural, or educational — places the student at the very center. Together, as a united community of parents, alumni, teachers, and friends, we reaffirm our shared mission: to safeguard and enhance the legacy of Budhanilkantha School for generations to come.

Mr. Mohan Karki, Alumni Liaison Officer - Budhanilkantha School

Mr. Karki highlighted the unique identity of SEBS and emphasized its role in school. He informed that two newsletters have already been published which has helped to bridge the gap between students and

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alumni. He expressed his gratitude as SEBS is helping with building gyms and building scholarship schemes for students.

He added that he will be reaching out to SEBSers for further enhancing the auditorium soon.

Mr. Keshar Khulal, Principal - Budhanilkantha School

The Principal thanked everyone and congratulated SEBS Executive Committee (2023-25) for their successful tenure. He felt that the committee fulfilled the core objectives and appreciated the President Santosh Bisht and his team for demonstrating their commitment.

He emphasized that SEBS and BNKS have a symbiotic partnership for progress as there exists a fundamental and unbreakable link between the two organizations. He emphasized that their fortunes are shared, emphasizing that the achievements and the downfalls of the two institutions go hand in hand. He congratulated Biswash Chepang, Sushant KC and Surya Karki for them being recognized in the 40 under 40 and took that as an example of how their achievements did both the institutions proud. He added that SEBSer as role models for current students and highlighted that students look to SEBSers for inspiration and guidance on navigating their future paths. He defined SEBSers' role beyond just alumni, calling them advisors and advocates for change.

Highlighting the immense value of SEBS's collective experience and professional knowledge, the Principal described it as an invaluable asset to the school. He expressed confidence that leveraging this expertise would lead the school toward continued growth and excellence. To that end, he encouraged SEBS to actively share their insights, emphasizing that their contribution would greatly benefit the institution and help guide it in the right direction. He also acknowledged that students often hesitate to seek support from SEBS and stressed the importance of building stronger connections to bridge this gap.

He further expressed his gratitude to the diverse teaching staff for their unified efforts. He encouraged alumni (SEBSers) to return as teachers, noting that they would already be accustomed to the school's environment, making the transition easier. He recalled that a group of SEBSers who joined in the 1990s have now mostly retired or at the verge of it, creating a gap that needs to be filled. While acknowledging that the school may not offer salaries as high as private institutions, he appealed to alumni's sense of duty, stating that their contribution would uphold the school's reputation and benefit both the alumni association and the school as a whole.



He further emphatically clarified that the SEBS in Nepal does not preside over the global SEBS fraternity, every SEBS member is an autonomous entity, empowered to operate under the esteemed SEBS banner under their own laws of the land where they are registered. However, he issued a stern warning that this privilege is not a license for exploitation or illicit activity in the alumni's name. On this critical point, he formally commended the current Executive Committee for its unwavering neutrality and principled stance. The future standing of the school under this new education act is a matter of profound concern to him. He illuminated that no existing statute compels SEBS to secure representation on the school's Board of Trustees or School Management Committee. He sounded an alarm regarding the impending education bill, cautioning that its provisions could severely curtail or even eliminated SEBS's currently active role, especially if the public is given an impression that SEBS is fragmented and is not sticking to its fundamental mission, vision and objectives. Consequently, he issued a forceful appeal to the assembly to categorically

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reject factionalism and petty disputes, urging instead for unity and resolutions of misunderstanding without the involvement of outside parties.

In closing, he called upon the General Assembly to exercise its vote with wisdom and foresight. He declared his readiness to collaborate with a President who embodies absolute neutrality, one who transcends personal ambition and rejects the practice of cronyism. He reminded the graduates that minor grievances are ultimately inconsequential, a burden to be shed for the sake of progress. He urged them to evolve, to elevate their perspective, and to cast their votes with sober judgment. Expressing a final note of resolve, he affirmed his hope that a truly deserving, responsible leader would emerge one capable of providing the visionary guidance necessary for the school's and alumni's enduring betterment.




Mr. Santosh Bisht, President - Society of Ex-Budhanilkantha Students

Mr. Bisht thanked everyone for the huge presence, their unwavering support, and shared passion throughout these two years of his tenure. He said we have not just sustained our legacy but we have built upon it. He said when he was elected he set ambitious goals, and emphasized that many of them have turned into tangible achievements, and mentioned it was not only his success alone but it was our collective victory. But cautioned that work was far from complete. He mentioned that SEBS must actively bridge the gap between our glorious alumni and the brilliant, young generation of SEBSers who are present today. Initiatives like our Alumni Talk Series have been vital in nurturing that unique bond. This connection is our lifeblood, and that we must fuel it unrelentingly with more activities.

To ensure this foundation is unshakable for generations to come, we must formalize our partnership. He said he during his tenure he championed the critical need for a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the school a powerful, legal written agreement that will forever cement our relationship and secure our shared future. He emphasized that our vision extends beyond our borders. We have initiated groundbreaking discussions to establish MOUs with international SEBS institutions, forging a global network of support and opportunity, but this will take time and careful discussions.

He further emphasized that while his time in SEBS is coming to an end, the momentum is now unstoppable. He said the current Executive Committee members have through committees, drafted foundational documents, and lit a fire that will not be extinguished. The architecture for a stronger, more connected, and legally empowered SEBS and BNKS relationship is now in the making. He emphasized the next generation of leaders to take this blueprint and build a future even brighter than we dared to imagine.

He further highlighted that over the past two years of his tenure, the Executive Committee was immediately confronted with the decade-old, pending case stemming from the 2015 earthquake relief efforts. Digging deep into this complex historical matter with the help of several dedicated SEBSers, we unearthed significant additional information and context; the commitment demonstrated by every member involved in this research was exemplary, leading to substantive findings. To ensure complete transparency, these findings were presented in a special general meeting that fostered intensive and productive discussions, and the complete report was formally shared with the District Administration Office (DAO). He highlighted that we have treated this not as a trouble but as a critical learning opportunity, leading to foundational changes within SEBS including the development of a robust financial policy, the adoption of professional accounting software, the implementation of corporate payment systems, and a renewed commitment to

greater operational transparency. It is therefore deeply disappointing that despite these corrective measures, a few individuals continue to use the DAO case not for betterment, but as a tool to harass the sitting President and Executive Committee members; this is annoying and entirely unsuited for our community. This case must serve as a lesson for the future, not a lever to disrupt our present activities.

He further extended his profound gratitude to the entire Executive Committee members for their unwavering support, to our beloved school for its constant assistance, to all the teachers and staff who helped SEBS organize events on campus, and to every volunteer and friend who walked with him through difficulties. A special thanks to the school Principal Keshar Bahadur Khulal and Alumni Liaison Officer Mohan Karki for their support and guidance. A very special thanks to those working tirelessly behind the scenes, like Susmita Pandey and Nairiti Rai, today's young volunteers who are helping us to run the AGM, whose hard work and dedication often go unseen but are truly the backbone of our success.

The president announced the end of the open session and to initiate the closed session.

1. **Annual Progress Report and Endorsement (Annex 2) - Aditi Singh, General Secretary**

Aditi Singh presented the SEBS Annual Progress Report for Fiscal Year 2081/82 (2024/25). The printed copies of the report were provided to the members. As per the request by the 42nd AGM and commitment by the Treasurer, the breakdown of donations was published in the Annual Report. She highlighted that the report includes a summary of activities that covers the entire two year tenure as well. She further emphasized that since the last two years SEBS Executive Committee started publishing the annual report to ensure greater transparency.

She further highlighted that alumni talk series has been regularized and institutionalized, and also requested any interested SEBSer to contact the SEBS office to be the speaker in the next alumni talk series that is commencing on 5th Sep, 2025. After the presentation, she requested for feedback and sought approval of the Annual Report, which was unanimously approved and the members appreciated the practice of publishing the annual report.

The General Secretary informed the attendees that more details could be found on the SEBS website (sebs.org.np). The Annual Progress Report was approved and endorsed by the AGM.

2. **Audit Report Approval & Appointment of Auditor for fiscal year 2081/82 (Annex 3) - Nitanta Singh Bista, Treasurer**

Nitanta Singh Bista, the Treasurer, presented SEBS's audited financial report for Fiscal Year 2081/82. He mentioned to the attendees that the financial details were available on the SEBS website (sebs.org.np). After the presentation, the treasurer requested feedback and sought approval of the report, which was unanimously approved without any further questions.

Both the audit report and the reappointment of B&K Associates as SEBS's auditor was unanimously approved.

3. **Alumni Building Construction Strategy - Suman Meher Shrestha, Chair and Amod Pyakuryal, Fundraising Chair of Alumni Building Committee**

Amod Pyakuryal, Fundraising Chair of Alumni Building Committee, highlighted that due to the learning from ongoing District Administration Office Case, it has become a challenge for SEBS to raise donations. He proposed under such circumstances, it is better to raise the required amount of funds and deposit it in a separate account of SEBS. He further emphasized that once the required amount was collected the funds will be handed over to the school and the school will initiate the construction works, following the school's procedures. He further suggested the design of the alumni building will be designed by SEBS in consultation with the school and certain amount as per SEBS financial policy will be allocated for overhead cost, which will be managed by SEBS for monitoring etc.

Since the strategy had the changed, he proposed to sign a new MOU between SEBS and the school with the new president and relevant members, which was unanimously approved.

4. **Special General Meeting Follow up (Annex 4) - Santosh Bisht, President**

The president noted that following the Special General Meeting of SEBS, its outcomes were thoroughly discussed in the Executive Committee meeting. As the Special General Meeting had formally approved the presentation concerning the 2015 earthquake funds, the subsequent report was officially submitted to the District Administration Office (DAO). The Chief District Officer (CDO) and the head of NGO unit appreciated that SEBS provided this comprehensive report along with additional information.

The president emphasized that he has consistently kept the Executive Committee members fully briefed on all developments in the DAO case since its inception, and he presented a detailed list of all the dates (Annex 4) on which these briefings occurred. Despite this transparency, two Executive Committee members, signed and submitted a letter to the SEBS office (Annex 4). In it, they claimed



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to have no details of the Special General Meeting pertaining to the case and stated they would therefore not take any responsibility for it; this letter was then forwarded to the DAO office. The president expressed his strong annoyance at this behavior, highlighting that these members had signed the attendance for the meetings where they were briefed, never submitted any formal note of dissent, and yet publicly refused accountability.

Addressing the assembly, the president stated that shifting blame onto others is not how true leaders behave. He felt compelled to highlight this issue because the incident had been floated on the SEBS Facebook page and alumni building group in WhatsApp, but he had refrained from responding in kind. He believed the correct procedure is to raise such dissatisfaction within the forum of the AGM, not on social media. The AGM subsequently asked for the members that wrote the letter to be invited to provide clarification, but they avoided the opportunity to do so.

In the discussion that followed, member Abhishek Basnyat highlighted that internal problems should not be taken to public to defame SEBS but should be resolved within the organization. He also pointed out the massive amount of work that had gone into handling the DAO case and that not acknowledging this effort was incorrect. When 419A Dilli Raj Joshi asked for the way forward, the president concluded that since the report has already been submitted to the DAO, there is little more SEBS can do on the matter at this point of time. 139A Suresh Acharya thanked the president Santosh Bisht for his good and strong leadership and suggested we move ahead and not discuss the issue further.

5. Question and Answer Session - Executive Committee Members, moderated by Umang Sharma

The question and answer session was overwhelmingly dominated by the DAO case. Member 419A Dilli Raj Joshi, directly asked how the case could be resolved and called for the relevant parties to clearly explain what they wanted. However, despite this direct request, no one present was in a position to provide a concrete answer or explanation for this core question. Vice President Apsana Shrestha contributed by clarifying that the funds in question had arrived through various channels, a detail which was thoroughly explained in the special general meeting's report. She further clarified that not all funds raised by SEBS NA were given to SEBS itself, as portions were also distributed to other organizations for relief work.

Other members offered their perspectives on handling the protracted issue. Member 125D Biswash pointed out that frequently going to the DAO for the same case was not a good practice and that the matter should be discussed internally instead. He strongly emphasized that blaming individuals without any concrete evidence of fraud was unacceptable, stating that anyone with concerns should come forward with solid proof. Member 764B Niraj Shrestha, questioned whether the ten-year-old case might be deemed redundant or dismissed. In response, Apsana Shrestha explained that audit reports are normally secured for five to seven years and noted that as a quasi-judicial body, the DAO has its limitations, suggesting the court system could be an alternative path forward.

The sentiment that the case had dragged on for too long was echoed by several members. 879B Abhishek, noted that he had been on the Executive Committee when the issue was discussed multiple



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times and praised the team assigned to investigate for their wonderful job. He revealed that he himself had moderated the Special General Meeting on this agenda and expressed frustration that the issue kept resurfacing, stating that "washing one's linen in public is not good" and it must be resolved within the organization. 255B Rabindra, suggested it might be time to hire lawyers and that the dissatisfied members should come forward to explain their demands. When 976B Santosh Shah was given the microphone asking for his views, he stated that he wished the best for SEBS and its betterment, offering no further commentary on the case.

The session was announced closed as no further questions were raised.

6. SEBS Election Committee Endorsement and Start of Election Process - Aditi Singh

The General Secretary informed the general assembly that the Executive Committee formed a three member election committee which comprised of 904A Bolaram Pandey as the Chair and members 288D Sharthak Neupane and 1131E Bhawana Adhikari. She further mentioned that the election committee will also submit a report upon the completion of the elections and she requested the general assembly to approve the election committee and the nomination of the three members, which was approved unanimously and subsequently the election committee thereafter took the responsibility for the election process.

The election committee explained the election process in detail to the general assembly and also provided time for contestants to deliver a speech focusing on their agenda. The election process was handled professionally and the entire process went well. Finally, after the elections and the final vote counting the election committee announced the results. The Chair, Bolaram Pandey announced the results and mentioned election was held for all the positions and that a new Executive Committee members were elected. Certificates to the newly elected members were handed over.

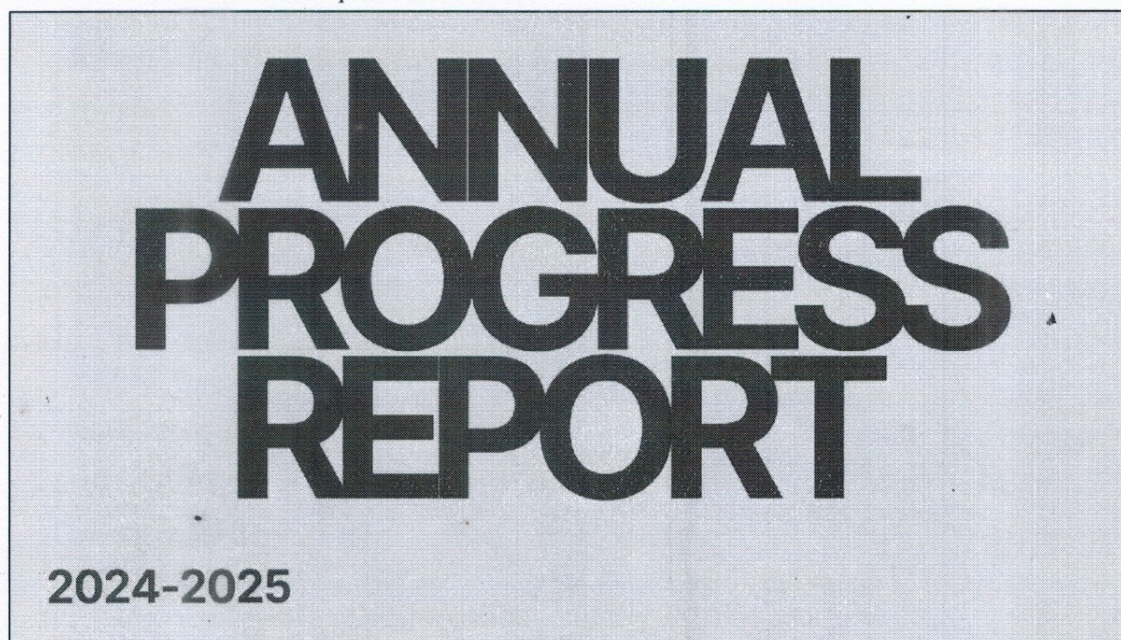

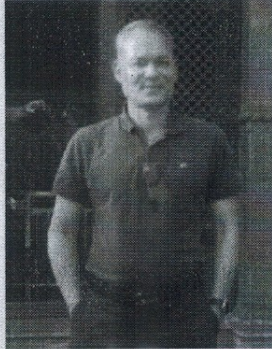
