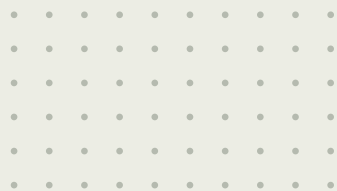

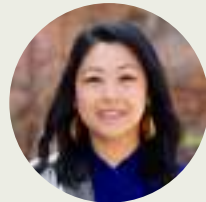

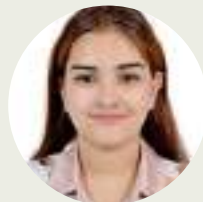

Member Engagement: World Cup Watch Party

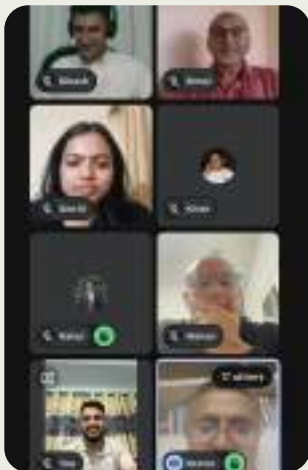


More than 25 SEBSers came together to enjoy an unforgettable night filled with football, laughter, great conversations, and the true spirit of our alumni community.

It was wonderful to see old friends reconnect, new friendships begin, and everyone united by the excitement of the World Cup Final.

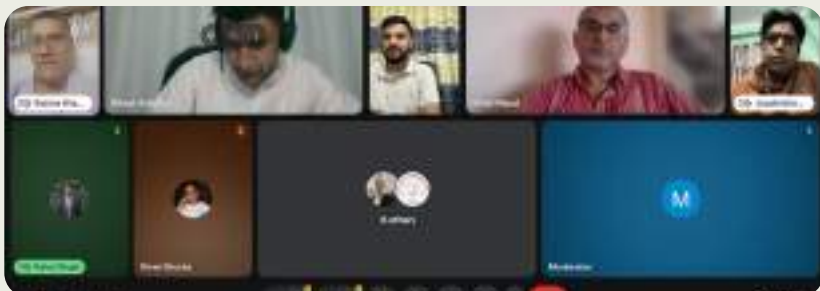

BNKS Support: Conjunctivitis Awareness & Screening Campaign



Following an outbreak of conjunctivitis among students, a screening and awareness campaign was conducted at Budhanilkantha School in coordination with B.P. Koirala Lions Centre for Ophthalmic Studies (BPKLCOS), TU Teaching Hospital. A team of doctors led by 948C Dr. Prativa conducted awareness sessions and screenings, focusing on prevention, hygiene, early identification of symptoms, and infection control. More than 200 students and faculty members were screened, with over 150 students identified as affected.

Severe cases were referred to the hospital, while affected students were advised to return home for proper care and to help prevent further transmission. The timely coordination between the school management and medical team ensured a prompt and effective response to the situation. Awareness today, prevention tomorrow together, we can keep our schools safe and healthy.

BNKS Support: Podcast Chautari

Community Support: SEBS Medical/Caretaker (Kuruwa) Support Project



SEBS initiated the Kuruwa Support Project following the Gen Z movement to support families struggling with caretakers' food and accommodation costs, which were not covered by government medical provisions. A four member Emergency Committee led by Vice President Devananda Yadav, with Vice President Yajaswi Rai, Treasurer Kushal Gautam, and Member Anjel Shahi, managed the project under a working modality developed by General Secretary Tilak Prasad Dhital.



Of 47 cases assessed, 14 were verified and supported. A total of NPR 485,000 was provided directly to victims, while total project payments amounted to NPR 582,453.50, including project related expenses. ICU and gunshot cases received at least 50% of the requested support, while requests below NPR 30,000 were fully supported based on need. All assistance was verified through required documents, photographs, and signed receipts.



Following the closure of collections on September 26, the project recorded total receipts of NPR 987,505 and a remaining balance of NPR 405,051.50. The remaining funds have been allocated to the SEBS Emergency and Disaster Relief Fund to ensure continued preparedness and timely support during future emergencies and disasters.
